

GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF GENERAL COUNSEL (HARRISBURG) ASSISTANT COUNSEL (ATTORNEY 2 or 3) PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

The Pennsylvania Governor's Office of General Counsel (OGC) seeks an experienced attorney to advise the Department of Health's Bureau of Emergency Medical Services (EMS) on day-to-day legal issues and represent the Bureau in certification and licensure actions before the Department of State and the Commonwealth Court. The position is located in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.

Day-to-day legal issues include regulatory drafting, review of state and federal regulations, legal analysis of issues relating to EMS Agency change of ownership, regulatory authority, and certification and licensure actions regarding EMS providers and agencies. Additionally, this Assistant Counsel will be expected to provide advice on novel issues as they arise. Litigation duties relating to certification and licensure actions will involve reviewing orders imposing civil monetary penalties, revocations, restrictions on license, and other statutorily permitted actions. Counsel will also need to review and respond to records requests and subpoenas.

OGC seeks an attorney with a minimum of four (4) years of experience in administrative law and in litigation, both before administrative tribunals and state courts. The ideal candidate will have demonstrated experience in advising an agency in the carrying out of its regulatory function, as well as the ability to ably represent EMS before administrative tribunals and courts to ensure the success of the Department of Health's overall mission.

The successful candidate will have excellent written and oral communications skills, including an attention to detail. They will have an ability to collegially and collaboratively provide timely advice to the Secretary of Health and her Deputates, considering agency business goals and needs. Solid interpersonal skills, including the ability to foster trust and respect and to create friendly and collaborative internal working relationships with internal Commonwealth clients and other attorneys in the Department are essential.
