



## GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF GENERAL COUNSEL (HARRISBURG) ASSISTANT COUNSEL (ATTORNEY 2 or 3) PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

The Pennsylvania Governor's Office of General Counsel (OGC) seeks an attorney to assist in the areas of procurement, grants and Right-to-Know Law (RTKL) within the Pennsylvania Department of Health (DOH). In accordance with OGC policy, a hybrid remote/in-office schedule based out of Harrisburg may be available at the General Counsel's discretion. The position will be filled at the Attorney 2 or 3 level, dependent on experience.

The ideal candidate will have familiarity with or an interest in developing expertise in the laws and processes applicable to the Commonwealth with a focus on procurements and grants. The successful candidate will work closely with other Department attorneys in handling matters in these areas, including drafting and negotiating documents associated with various types of transactions. The successful candidate will regularly interface with senior officials in DOH as well as staff from other state agencies and offices.

Additionally, the position will work closely with the Department's Records Legal Liaison and Open Records Officer in the handling of requests for records made under the Pennsylvania RTKL. This attorney will be required to understand and apply the RTKL in processing and responding to RTKL requests and appeals, including appellate court work. Experience with Pennsylvania's RTKL is beneficial, but not required.

The position requires excellent written and oral communication skills, attention to detail, excellent interpersonal skills, and the ability to foster trust and respect, including creating friendly and collaborative working relationships with colleagues and clients.

The Governor's Office of General Counsel provides efficient, responsive legal services to the Commonwealth, the Governor, members of his cabinet and more than 30 executive branch agencies, including DOH, that conduct the business of the Commonwealth. This includes rendering legal advice and representation concerning matters and issues arising in connection with the operation of executive agencies under the Governor's jurisdiction, as well as select independent agencies.
