The Pennsylvania Governor's Office of General Counsel (OGC) seeks a licensed attorney to serve as Assistant Counsel in the Office of the Budget (OB). This position is based in Harrisburg and will be classified as an Attorney 1. OB is the fiscal manager for the Commonwealth's Executive Branch and is directly involved in the creation, management, and auditing of the Commonwealth's \$60+ billion annual budget and spending. This Assistant Counsel will assist the OB Chief Counsel by:

- Participating in the Commonwealth's issuance of its General Obligation bonds including public financial disclosure issues, and in bond issues and similar financial transactions and public financial disclosure by other Commonwealth agencies and authorities;
- Representing OB in labor and employment matters before the State Civil Service Commission, PA Human Relations Commission, Unemployment Compensation referees, the federal Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, and other tribunals;
- Reviewing and preparing responses to all Right to Know Law (RTKL) requests received by OB, and representing OB in appeals of those responses to the Office of Open Records;
- Working on legal actions brought against OB (e.g., drafting pleadings, responding to pleadings, and managing discovery requests), and in litigation brought against the Commonwealth as directed by the General Counsel or the Chief Counsel;
- Participating in transactional work (e.g., drafting and reviewing contracts and other forms of agreement); and,
- Working on general law matters (e.g., legal research; tax laws; research and interpretation of constitutional, statutory, and contract/agreement issues) that arise from OB's operations.

This position represents is a unique opportunity for an entry-level lawyer, and is eligible for telework after completion of initial training. The successful applicant for will have demonstrated: (1) solid legal research, analysis and reasoning capabilities; (2) good interpersonal and communication skills; (3) an ability to identify and help resolve problems creatively and with professional discretion; (4) a willingness to handle a variety of legal matters both independently and as part of a team; (5) an interest in transactional matters; and (6) an ability to interact and function effectively within both the greater legal community and a governmental organization.

The Governor's Office of General Counsel provides efficient, responsive legal services to the Commonwealth, the Governor, members of his cabinet and more than 30 executive branch and independent agencies that conduct the business of the Commonwealth. This includes rendering legal advice and representation concerning matters and issues arising in connection with the operation of executive agencies under the Governor's jurisdiction, as well as select independent agencies. OB's mission is to develop, coordinate and oversee the execution of a balanced financial plan for the

commonwealth that reflects the policies and priorities of the governor, promotes the efficient allocation and use of resources, and ensures that all funds received and disbursed for commonwealth programs are accounted for in accordance with current laws, regulations, and policies.

Candidates must have a Juris Doctor degree from an ABA-accredited law school and be a member in good standing with the Pennsylvania Bar.
